- Module title and brief description
- Module objectives, described in terms of competences
- Prerequisite knowledge

2. Central body

- Learning materials (organized into teaching units)

3. Output section

- Examination and assessment materials
- Connections with other modules

- Duration

Once the modules have been defined and titled, we must decide and report about:

- a. Final objectives and global prerequisite knowledge
- b. Global connection structure; it could be:
 - a serial structure, in which there is a strict sequentiality among topics and concepts,
 - a parallel structure, whereas there is evidence of strong cross connections among topics and concepts belonging to different modules.
